The Port of Oakland and City of Oakland have requested my support for their application for funding under the US Department of Transportation TIGER IV discretionary grant program to convert the former Oakland Army Base (OAB) into a thriving Trade and Logistics Center by developing the Port's Phase I Intermodal Rail Project.

It has been more than ten years since the Oakland Army Base was decommissioned and is past due for economic redevelopment.
